Tbilisi State Medical University

Tbilisi State Medical University (TSMU) is a leading medical university in Tbilisi, Georgia. More than 85 years have passed since Tbilisi State Medical Institute was founded based on the faculty of Medicine at Tbilisi State University. In 1992 Tbilisi State Medical Institute was renamed Medical University.

TSMU is the eighth-ranked (out of 55) higher-education institution in Georgia. There are almost 7500 undergraduate and 3000 postgraduate students at the University about 25% of whom come from foreign countries. Tbilisi State Medical University has undergone an Institutional Evaluation Programme, performed by the Association of European.

Ivane Javakhishvili Tbilisi State University

Ivane Javakhishvili Tbilisi State University is a public research university established on 8 February 1918 in Tbilisi, Georgia. Excluding academies and theological seminaries, which have intermittently functioned in Georgia for centuries, TSU is the oldest university in Georgia and the Caucasus region.

The total enrollment is over 23,500 students, and there are 5,000 faculty and staff members (collaborators) overall. According to the U.S. News & World Report university rankings, TSU is ranked 398th in the world, tied with the University of Warsaw.

Masters programs were added to the Bachelors Programs during these years. By 2007 the university had already received its first Ph.D. program students. In 2010, for the first time in the post-Soviet era, the United States Agency OPIC (Overseas Private Investment Corporation) invested multimillion dollars in the development of the university's infrastructure.

The university cooperates with the European and US leading universities and offers exchange programs at various European universities for one semester or a year. Thus the university has exchange programs within the individual cooperation, Erasmus Plus.

From 29 October 2021, European University is an individual associate member of the European University Association. European University has two campuses as well as a dormitory. The university has a logo, seal, and title page, approved by the Rector.

In 2022, European University has become the owner of Jo Ann Medical Center which was renamed Jo Ann University Hospital. The hospital will be chaired by Tamar Zarginava, Vice-Rector of the European University.

Times Higher Education Impact Rankings ranked the European University 1001+ in the world in 2022. The European University is Georgia's only university listed in the Times Higher Education Impact Rankings 2022.

Caucasus International University

Georgian Technical University

Georgian Technical University (GTU) is the main and largest technical university in Georgia. It is located in the capital city of Tbilisi. Founded in 1922 as a polytechnic faculty of the Tbilisi State University. The first lecture was read by Georgian Mathematician Professor Andrea Razmadze. It was transformed in 1928 into an independent "Georgian Polytechnic Institute" and achieved University status by 1990.

Georgian Technical University has provided over 60% of Georgia's engineering, chemistry, and scientific industry specialists for the last eighty years. Additionally, over the recent years, GTU added more establishments, "Caucasus Business School" — a joint project of GTU, Tbilisi State University, and Georgia State University (Atlanta, Georgia, USA), German Studies faculty, a Franco-Georgian Studies Faculty, and a "Cisco Networking Academy". GTU also has thirteen offspring institutes all over the country.

GTU uses the ECTS grading scale and awards degrees and diplomas in Diploma of Specialist, Bachelor of Science, Bachelor of Arts, and Master of Science. GTU also awards scientific PhDs that require three or more years of advanced studies depending on specialty. All degrees are also provided as part-time and distance studies; these may take much longer to complete.

GTU's scientific library is one of the largest libraries in Georgia, comprising 1,254,000 books of which many are unique and rare finds, and 500,000 periodic materials. Plans are underway for digitizing this large collection of knowledge.
